

Macmillan Nurse Palliative Care Specialist Service for people with Learning Disabilities

Shining a light on the future



This leaflet provides a brief summary of the service and contact information.

Aim of the service

The Macmillan service gives special support to individuals with learning disabilities in Northumberland.

- Provide a flexible/responsive/specialist service: assisting in the provision of Palliative Care for individuals with a learning disability who have a life limiting or terminal illness
- Using a specialist approach to raise the profile of people with learning disabilities and facilitating access to mainstream health care services, acting as a resource for advice, information and support.
- To work within the Northumberland Macmillan Team in providing appropriate symptom control and specialist Palliative Care.
- To offer support and advice to clients and their families, who are supporting an individual with a life limiting or cancer diagnosis.
- To offer support/advice to colleagues, professionals within formal and informal networks, including the provision of education and training as requested.
- To provide bereavement support sessions for individuals with a learning disability.

What will the Macmillan service provide?

The Macmillan team are nurses who have additional training which gives them expertise in pain/symptom control and emotional support for patients and their carers.

As part of the Macmillan service in Northumberland, a nurse who is specifically trained to care for people with learning disabilities will complement the delivery of specialist palliative care for this client group by working within the existing Macmillan team.

The Macmillan team work closely with the Primary Healthcare Team to help in the management and support of patients and their families/carers at any time in their illness from the point of diagnosis.

- Patients and their families
- Medical staff
- Other Macmillan nurses/physiotherapists
- Specialist nurses
- Social Services
- Allied health professionals

When/why you might refer

- Support at diagnosis
- Support in providing end of life care
- Pain/symptom management
- Help with investigations, diagnosis and treatment
- As a resource for advice/information
- Bereavement support
- Psychological support
